## Mississippi

Crimes Against Society represent society's prohibition against engaging in certain types of activity; they are typically victimless crimes in which property is not the object.

### SOCIETY CRIME

Society Crime consists of Drug Offenses, Weapon Offenses, Gambling Offenses, Prostitution, Pornography/Obscene Material and Animal Cruelty.

**Crimes:** 21,249      **Arrests:** 14,729      **Clearance Rate:** 73.06%

A crime is cleared one of two ways: when at least one offender is arrested; or by exceptional means, when situations beyond law enforcement's control prevent the agency from arresting the offender (for example, the death of an offender).

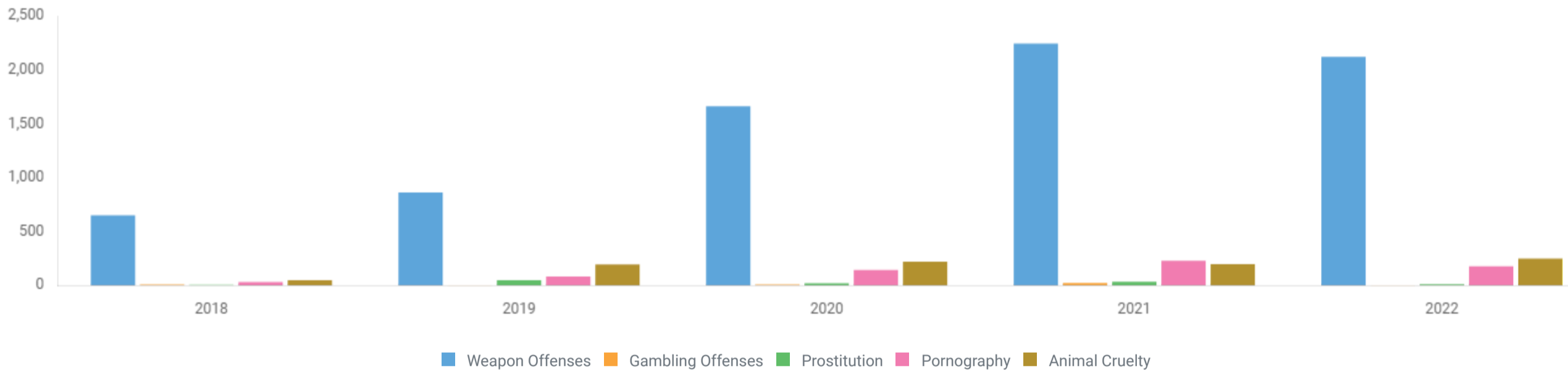

### DRUG OFFENSES

The violation of laws prohibiting the production, distribution, and/or use of certain controlled substances and the equipment or devices utilized in their preparation and/or use.

This is broken into Drug/Narcotics Violations, relating to controlled drug or narcotics; and Drug Equipment Violations, relating to equipment or devices utilized in preparing and/or using these substances.

**Crimes:** 18,689      **Arrests:** 13,839      **Clearance Rate:** 75.81%

All arrests related to drug crime are counted, regardless of the actual offense(s) for which the arrestee has been charged.

### DRUG/NARCOTICS VIOLATIONS

The unlawful cultivation, manufacture, distribution, sale, purchase, use, possession, transportation, or importation of any controlled drug or narcotic substance.

Crimes: 13,041    Arrests: 11,106    Clearance Rate: 75.62%

### DRUG EQUIPMENT VIOLATIONS

The unlawful manufacture, sale, purchase, possession, or transportation of equipment or devices utilized in preparing and/or using drugs or narcotics.

Crimes: 5,648    Arrests: 4,894    Clearance Rate: 76.27%

All arrests related to drug equipment violations are counted, regardless of the actual offense(s) for which the arrestee has been charged.

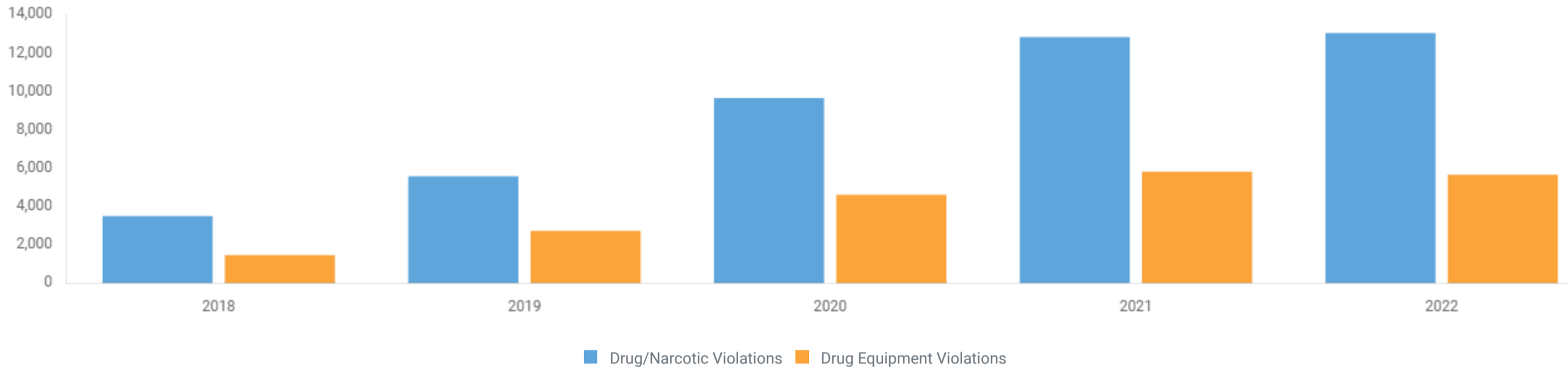

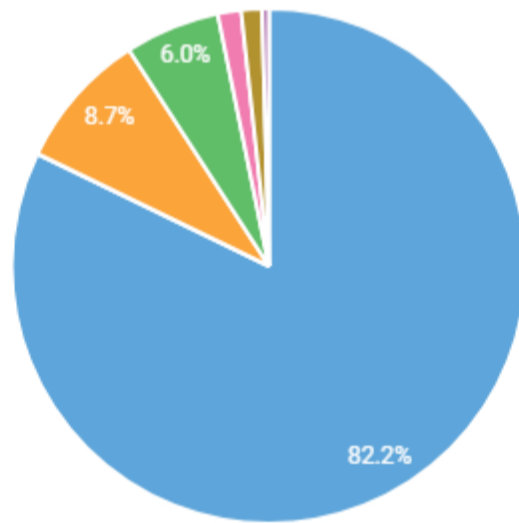

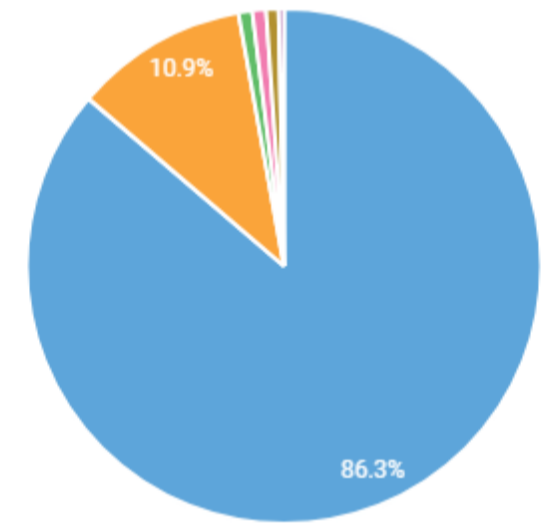

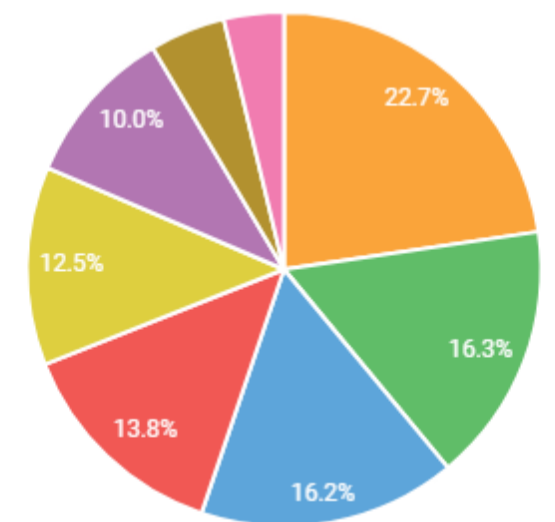

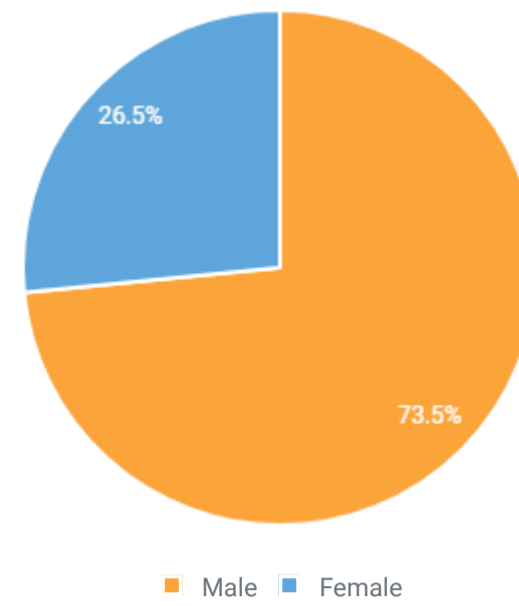

All Drug Offenses Combined



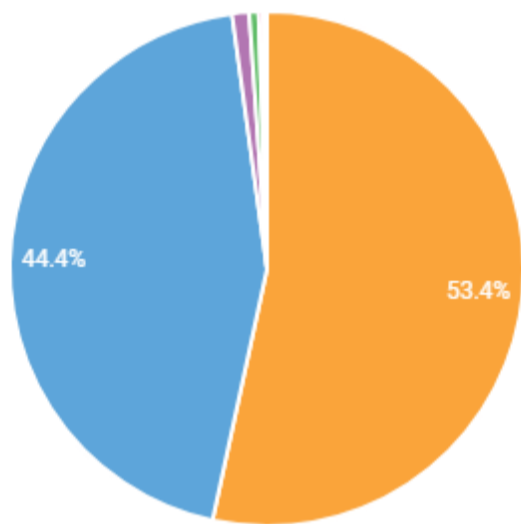
### ARRESTEE SEX

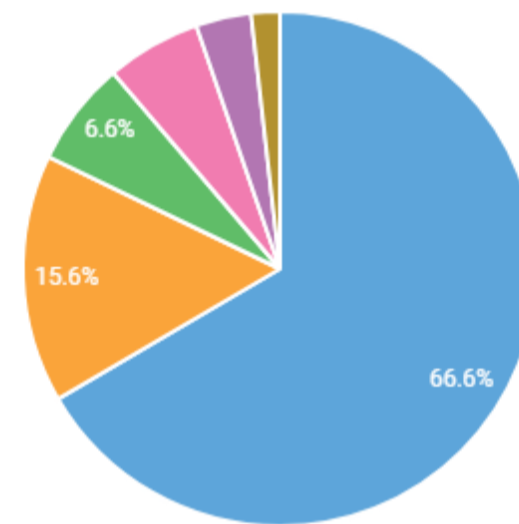

The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, concealment, or use of firearms, cutting instruments, explosives, incendiary devices, or other deadly weapons.

Crimes: 2,124    Arrests: 1,548    Clearance Rate: 60.36%

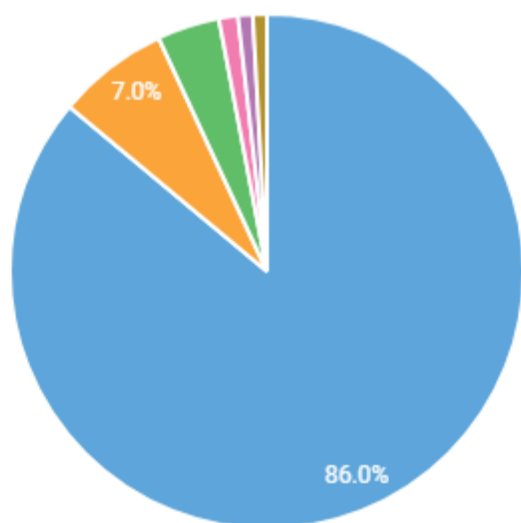

To unlawfully bet or wager money or something else of value; assist, promote, or operate a game of chance for money or some other stake; possess or transmit wagering information; manufacture, sell, purchase, possess, or transport gambling equipment, devices or goods; or tamper with the outcome of a sporting event or contest to gain a gambling advantage.

Crimes: 1    Arrests: 2    Clearance Rate: 0%

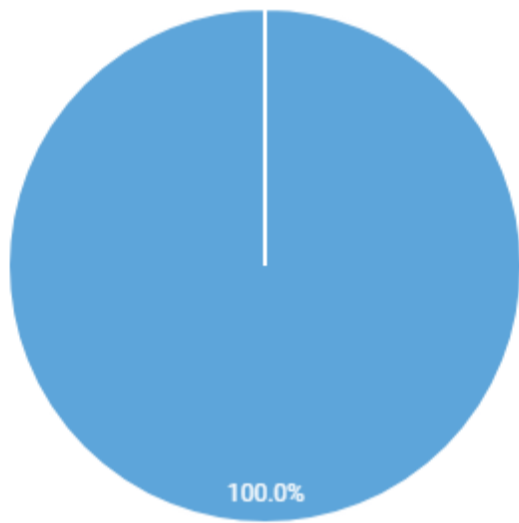

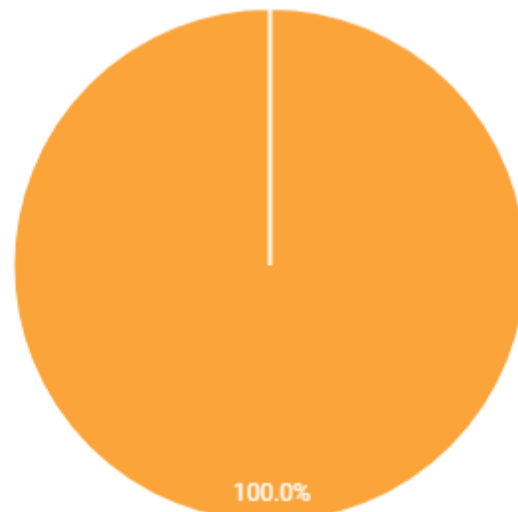

## PROSTITUTION OFFENSES

To unlawfully engage in or promote sexual activities for anything of value; to solicit customers or transport persons for prostitution purposes; to own, manage, or operate a dwelling or other establishment for the purpose of providing a place where prostitution is performed, or to otherwise assist or promote prostitution; to purchase or trade anything of value for commercial sex acts.

Crimes: 11    Arrests: 6    Clearance Rate: 36.36%

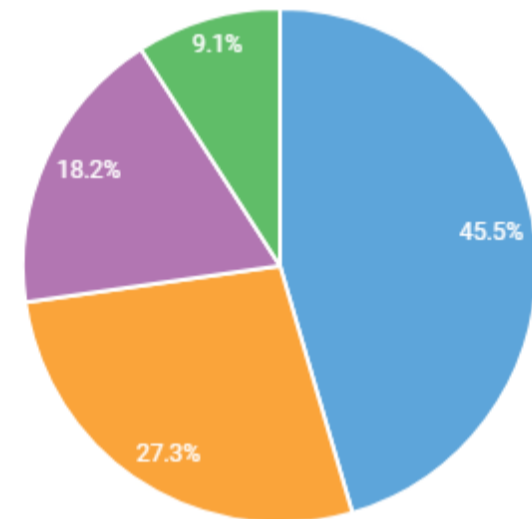

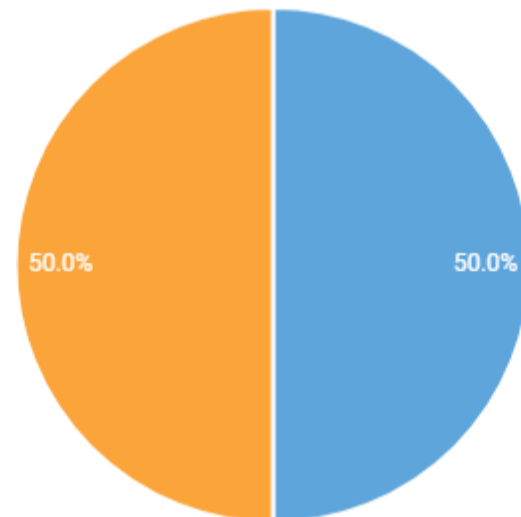

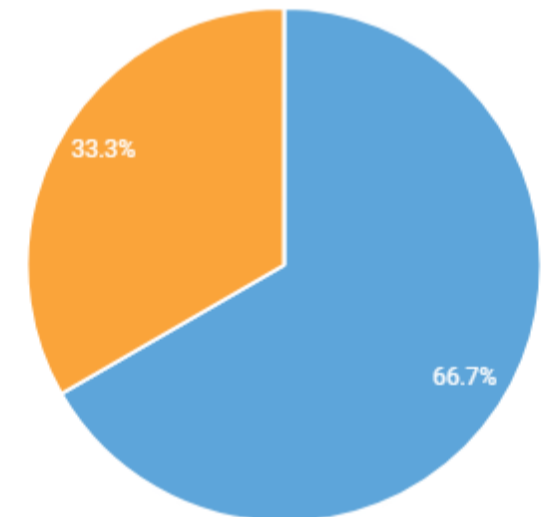

The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, publishing, sale, purchase, or possession of sexually explicit material, e.g., literature, photographs, etc.

Crimes: 176    Arrests: 38    Clearance Rate: 24.43%

### ANIMAL CRUELTY



Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly taking an action that mistreats or kills any animal without just cause, such as torturing, tormenting, mutilation, maiming, poisoning, or abandonment. Included are instances of duty to provide care, e.g., shelter, food, water, care if sick or injured; transporting or confining an animal in a manner likely to cause injury or death; causing an animal to fight with another; inflicting excessive or repeated unnecessary pain or suffering, e.g., uses objects to beat or torture an animal. This definition does not include proper maintenance of animals for show or sport; use of animals for food, lawful hunting, fishing, or trapping.

Crimes: 248 Arrests: 26 Clearance Rate: 10.48%
